EARTO The mission of the <u>High Level Expert Group</u> (HLEG) on ICR The High Level Expert Group (HLEG) on ICR will identify...

- a number of recommendations to knowledge & research intensive SMEs and private stakeholders (financial organizations, accounting and other business organisations), and

- public policy options to stimulate research intensive SMEs to report on their intellectual capital.

The group will review and assess the definition of research intensive SMEs, the relevant categories of Intellectual Capital, why these are important to research intensive SME s and the financial sector and how we can stimulate research intensive SME s to report on their intellectual capital. An overview will be provided of recent initiatives, current challenges, and existing trends, as well as comparative analysis based on a selected number of national case studies.

In its final report the HLEG will also consider how its recommendations may be taken forw. By the Community Member States or private sector initiatives. (In the long run ~ 4 years, a directive on IC reporting may be expected ?)

- Promotion & awareness creation in Europe
- IC Portal as an information access to ICR issues
- Creation of a European "ICR Award"
- Guide for SMEs on how to produce an ICR
- Catalyse curricula on ICR & promote them !!!
- Get financial institutions (e.g. EIB) involved
- Recommend ICR as an instrument for making decisions on public (financial) support
- Application of ICR method as a decision tool for government agencies
- Commence of further research on intellectual capital analysis as a most important discipline of the knowledge economy
- Extend towards "ICR for regions & nations"



Specific recommendations to the EUROTECH Board

EARTO

- Observe the ICR topic also in future, as it will take much more influence on R&D management and on CECs future programme management as can be imaginated by today, because strategy of the Commission is to raise new investment money (starting through the EIB) for the support of achieving the 3% Lisbon goal !
- Engage to introduce the ICR methodology by applying a consolidated ICR method in your own organisations NOW.
- Consider to take the lead in educating the next generation of R&D managers from EUROTECH organisations on subjects of "intellectual economy" e.g. through an education program

With the closure of the working agenda on Intellectual Capital Reporting, my mission within EUROTECH is completed.
